Dear Church Family,

We all know that you never pray for patience. If we do, God will most certainly challenge our patience by having us wait in really long lines or get stuck on the highway for hours because of a wreck. It never fails, right?

Yet, we are to be patient with each other. The apostle Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 13:4a: "Love is patient, love is kind." In 1 Thessalonians 14, we are reminded: "And we urge you, beloved, to admonish the idlers, encourage the faint hearted, help the weak, be patient with all of them." To be patient with others is to be loving. To be impatient with others is to be rude, selfish, unloving, unkind, and self-centered. So, even though we don't like to ask for patience, we need to be asking God to help us be patient with others. Now, as for being stuck in long lines or waiting on inanimate objects, that is another matter entirely.

Although I try to be very patient with others, I am notorious in my family for being impatient when I have to wait or when I want something right away. Mark and Devin make a lot of jokes at my expense about my lack of patience. Now, I have gotten better at being patient in many situations, such as lines in stores. Even so, all of the delays make the entire process quite challenging. I know that one day it will be fantastic to live in a house that Mark and I designed to have all of the features that I have dreamed about (or grumbled that I did not have in past homes). Yet, we started this process over two years ago, and our projected move-in date is the end of May 2024! You can imagine that this lengthy process is trying my patience, and secretly, I keep wondering if I accidentally prayed to God for patience and forgot about it.

In the second week of September, my impatience turned to excitement. The framing finally began. Now, I can see the rooms taking shape. I am seeing my vision come to life. Now, that is exciting! I still can't wait to move in, but now I feel a little different. I am starting to enjoy the process and find it fascinating to see my dreams become reality. I feel infinitely blessed to be a part of this community, to live on a lake (just as my grandparents and great-grandparents did), and to have not just a roof over my head, but everything I ever wanted in a house.



CHICKEN & STUFFING RECIPE

1-1/2 cups water

- ¹/₄ cup margarine
- 2 (10 oz) pkg chopped frozen broccoli
- 2 (6oz) pkg quick-cooking stuffing mix (such as Stove Top)
- 1 (10.75 oz) can cream of chicken soup (or cream of mushroom soup)
- 1 (8 oz) sour cream or plain yogurt
- 1/3 cup milk
- 3 cups cooked & shredded chicken ... you can use canned. (Drain canned chicken)

Directions:

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Spray 9x13 container with cooking spray. Bring water and margarine to a boil in saucepan and stir in stuffing mix.

*Remove saucepan from heat, cover and let sit about 5 minutes until water is absorbed. Fluff stuffing with fork.

Precook broccoli slightly in boiling water. Mix cream soup, sour cream and milk together in bowl. Spread stuffing mix over bottom of baking dish. Add chicken layer. Add broccoli layer. Top with soup/sour cream/milk mixture. Bake in preheated oven for about 1 hour until hot and bubbly.

War of the Worlds

Eighty-five years ago, on October 30, 1938, Orson Welles and the Mercury Theatre staged a radio adaptation of the H.G. Wells sci-fi novel *The War of the Worlds* that fooled at least some Americans into believing that Martians really were invading the United States.

The show was set up to seem like a normal music program that kept getting interrupted by increasingly alarming, official sounding "news-bulletins" that tracked the violent progress of a Martian invasion centered in New Jersey. Traditional accounts maintain that despite announcements that the show was fictional, many Americans thought the broadcast was real. The next day, newspapers carried tales of mass panic, and Orson Welles met with the press to express regret for the confusion. Not everyone believed the Martian story ... Those who only caught part of the broadcast or heard the news secondhand often merely believed that a disaster of some kind had struck the East Coast. Many who had initially been fooled called their local newspaper or police station to verify the story and learned that it was fiction. Still, many were truly frightened by the broadcast.

This was not the only time *War of the Worlds* was broadcast. It happened in 1944 in Chile. Next, it happened in 1949 in Quito, Ecuador, causing widespread hysteria. When it was revealed that it was fictional, the fear turned into an angry riot that attacked the radio station, causing \$350,000.00 in damage. Then again, in 1968 in Buffalo, NY.

In remembrance of October 30, 1938, you might consider watching the 1953 black and white movie version, or the 2005 Tom Cruise *War of the Worlds*. Both movies are well worth watching, guaranteed to thrill you!

Pink Tourmaline is the 'modern' birthstone for October and symbolizes a love of humanity.

Opel is the 'traditional' birthstone and symbolizes hope, purity and truth.


October's birth flower is the bright orange **marigold** which represents winning grace and the cosmos, which is a symbol of joy.
